!KNOW YOUR RIGHTS!

Although paid housework is the main source of income for female immigrants, very few employers actually abide by the standards that apply to every type of work.

They disregard basic workers rights, such as maternity protection, pension benefits, paid vacations, and basic safety standards. Immigrant workers also face serious difficulties in other areas of work: not getting paid for the work they did or not being compensated for overtime are common occurrences.

We, from the **AK Undocumented Work**, believe in collective solutions to these problems. We strive for social change that ends all forms of discrimination. A first step would be to recognize immigrants as workers regardless of their legal status in Europe

It is important to know that you have rights even if you don't have a residence permit for Europe. You are not alone: **ver.di**, a service workers union represents ALL workers.

How To Prevent Wage Theft?



Write down how much you worked, including all your overtime, and work on weekends and nights. Mention the type of work you did, the exact workplace, and the name of the person who gave you instructions.



Know your colleagues, their names and how to get in touch with them.



Get as much information about your employer as you can: name and official address of the company; when working on a construction site, the name of the main contractor is important as well.



Take pictures at work so that you have proof of the work you did.



Take notes on verbal agreements you have with your employer. If possible, make agreements only in the presence of witnesses.



When taking legal steps against your employer, the first step is a so-called collection procedure (Mahnverfahren). You can find official orders to pay at the local court (Amtsgericht). For more information on how to fill out the order to pay (Mahnbescheid) and the procedure in general, get in touch with **ver.di** at the times mentioned on the front of this flyer.
